MATCH PREVIEW

El Paso Locomotive FC (8-6-4, 28 pts., West-5) goes on the road for a midweek match-up against Rio Grande Valley FC (7-8-1, 22pts., West-10) in their first Copa Tejas meeting of 2022. Kickoff from H-E-B Park in Edinburg, Texas is set for Wednesday, June 29 at 6:30 p.m. MT and will be broadcast live ESPN+.

El Paso Locomotive FC goes into Wednesday night's match as the defending Copa Tejas champions and red hot following a 5-0 dismantling of New York Red Bulls II. The Locos are reaching full strength with the return of players from injury or international duty. Standing undefeated in it's last seven matches, the Locos have outscored their opponents 12 to 4 with four clean sheets. With momentum and confidence squarely on El Paso Locomotive FC's side, it will now travel to the southern tip of the Lone Star state to H-E-B Park.

After three matches in Edinburg, Locomotive FC has yet to come away with points. The most recent outing closed out the 2021 USL Championship regular season, ending in a 4-1 loss for the Locos. Now the strong El Paso squad will play its second game in five days against an RGV side that finds itself below the playoff line but not far from it. Rio Grande Valley FC has been average in its last five games, taking a record of 2-2-1. Most recently, RGVFC claimed a 1-0 win over Pittsburgh Riverhounds on June 18. The Toros have had a week and half of rest as it prepares to welcome an in form El Paso side that is seeking to solidify a spot above the playoff line.

PREVIOUSLY VS OPPONENT

Locomotive and Rio Grande Valley closed the 2021 USL Championship regular season with El Paso falling 1-4 in October. Midfielder Chapa Herrera scored the lone Locomotive goal early in the second half.

Rio Grande Valley set the tempo of the match, converting a penalty in the seventh minute through Rodrigo Lopez. While Locomotive earned a goal that was ultimately flagged offside, RGV's Kyle Edwards doubled up the lead just before the halftime whistle. Locomotive fought to salvage the scoring with a decisive play from Diego Luna found Herrera who took one-touch to earn the Locomotive goal.

Despite Locomotive putting itself back in the fight, Rio Grande Valley pulled away. Kyle Edwards earned his second of the night in the 59th minute before Emilio Ycaza sealed the game with a 79th minute goal.

Hinds found massive success with the Zips, reaching back-to-back conference championships while recording 11 goals in 44 appearances. Hinds rejoined the Sounders where he played for the Tacoma Defiance, making 68 appearances with one goal.

A versatile player on the left-wing, Hinds is able to slot in defensively and on the wing through the midfield, making him a dangerous box-to-box player.

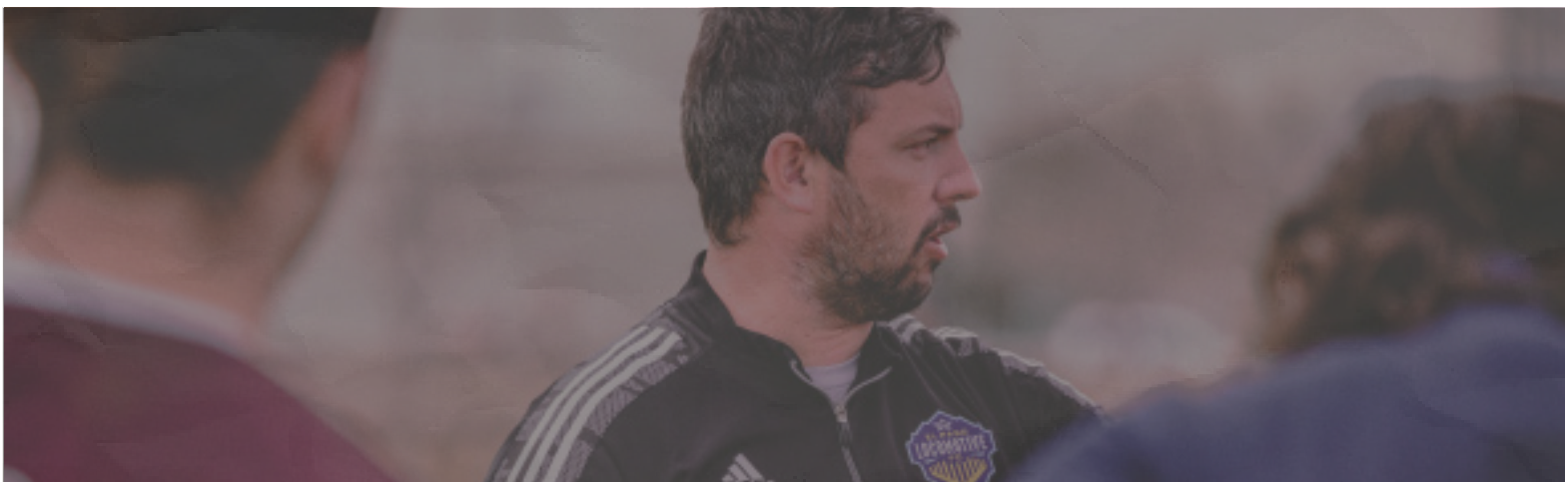
